

English

The main focus of our English topic this term will be Shakespeare and we will be focussing on the play A Midsummer Night's Dream. The children will be learning this alongside practising for a performance of A Midsummer Night's Dream in Knowsley Arts and Culture Centre.

Our areas of English we will focus on include: recounts and play scripts (formal and informal).

Maths Number: Place Value

Read, write, order and compare numbers up to 10,000,000 and determine the value of each digit

Round any whole number to a required degree of accuracy.

Use negative numbers in context and calculate intervals across zero.

Solve number and practical problems that involve all of the above.

Number : Four rules including: adding and subtracting whole numbers, multiply up to a 4 digit number by a 1 digit number, short division, division using factors, common factors and multiples, prime numbers, square and cube numbers, order of operations, mental calculations and estimation and reasoning from known facts.

Homework will be given out when needed. Specific homework will also be given out when needed to help support or further your child's learning. Children will also be given a reading book with the aim that they read for pleasure as often as possible. Books will be changed fortnightly. We urge you to read with your child as much as possible at home and also record their progress in their Reading Record.

Science- Living things and their habitats. Children will describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common characteristics and similarities and differences.

Topic - Comparing people and places.

We will be looking at and comparing three locations; Stratford Upon Avon (linked with Shakespeare), Greece and the Peruvian Andes. We will learn about climate, culture, population and life expectancy as well as the geographical features of each location.

Describe and understand key aspects of human geography such as the distribution of natural resources including energy, food, minerals and water.

Understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of human and physical geography of a region of the UK, a region of a European country and a region within North or South America.

Identify the lines and zones on a globe, including time zones, knowing the significance of latitude, longitude, Greenwich meridian and time zones (including day/night).
