Vocabulary	
Pattern	Repeated beats, rhythm, sounds or words.
Pitch	The highness or lowness of a sound.
Melody	A sequence of notes or rhythms played or sung together.
Rhythm	Combinations of long and short sounds.
Pulse	The steady beat of the music.
Rhyme	When the ends of words sound the same. For example, 'dog' and 'frog'
Phrase	Part of a piece of music.
