	Crochet
	Quaver— half a crotchet
	Minim — two counts
	Semibreve - four counts

### Vocabulary

Graphic Notation	A symbol used to represent a sound.
Motif	A short musical idea.
Palindrome	A series of notes that sound the same played forward or backward, such as the notes ABCBA.
Pulse	The steady beat of the music.
Structure	The shape of a piece of music.
