## What I should already know

- The children have some knowledge of mixing colours to create another..

## Sticky Knowledge

Primary colours can be mixed to make secondary colours:

There are many different shades (or "hues") of the same colour.

Changing the amount of the primary colours mixed affects the shade of the secondary colour produced.

To print with objects you need to apply a suitable layer of paint to the printing surface.

## Vocabulary

Hue	Describing an exact colour: sky blue, dark green, rose pink
Mix	Combining two or more colours together
Pattern	Pattern is a design in which shapes, colours or lines are repeated
Primary colours	Red, yellow and blue
Print	Transferring an image onto another surface e.g. finger painting
Secondary colours	Orange, green and purple—made by mixing two primary colours

## Technical Knowledge and skills

- How to use a sketchbook to explore ideas
- Know primary colours can be mixed to make secondary colours:- Red + yellow = orange- Yellow + blue = green- Blue + red = purple
