

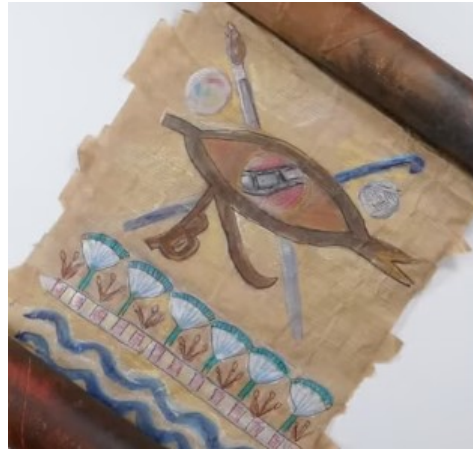

## What I should already know

- Key questions and metacognition strategies will continue to be used to encourage pupils to recognise the factors that influence their own performance and the different approaches they can use for their learning. You can construct a new paper material using paper, water and glue

Layering materials in opposite directions make handmade paper stronger.

Pattern can be man-made (like a printed wallpaper) or natural (like a giraffe's skin).

Artists have different materials available to them depending on when they live in history.
