### What I should already know

- ◆ 'What happened next?' - after reading a story or looking at other sequences of events, such as getting dressed, planting a seed or making a sandwich.
- ◆ Children bring in photographs of themselves as babies and discuss how they have changed over time.
- ◆ Patterns and routines, taking part in events to celebrate time.
- ◆ Toys can be new and used.

### Sticky Knowledge

- ◆ The Beatles became a world famous pop group from Liverpool and their music is still very popular today.
- ◆ The England football team won the World Cup for the only in 1966 and the final was played at Wembley, London.
- ◆ Queen Elizabeth II was the queen during the 1960s.
- ◆ In the 1960's there was a space race between Russia and America - to be first to land on the moon.
- ◆ Fashion changed greatly in the 1960s with colourful, hippie-style clothes being very popular.
- ◆ School was different in the 1960s. There were no computers or whiteboards. Teachers wrote on blackboards with chalk. Music and Movement lessons were broadcast through the radio and children watched educational programmes on a big television on wheels.
- ◆ There are some toys and games from the 1960s that are still popular today. There were less cars so most children played outside in the street.
- ◆ There were only 3 television channels. BBC1 BBC2 and ITV and television programmes were not on all day.
- ◆ Homes in the 1960s were very different to today.
